## **Highlights**

- Strong storms expected this evening into the overnight hours.
  - <u>Slight Risk</u> for Severe Weather tonight
- Showers with isolated thunderstorms are possible for the day on Tuesday with a cold front passing in the evening.
  - Marginal Risk for Severe Weather on Tuesday
- Clearing skies with seasonable temperatures Wednesday and Thursday.
- Showers possible Friday evening ahead of yet another cold front.






Low pressure over the Gulf States continues to bring a chance of thunder to the coastal areas of NC & SC.


