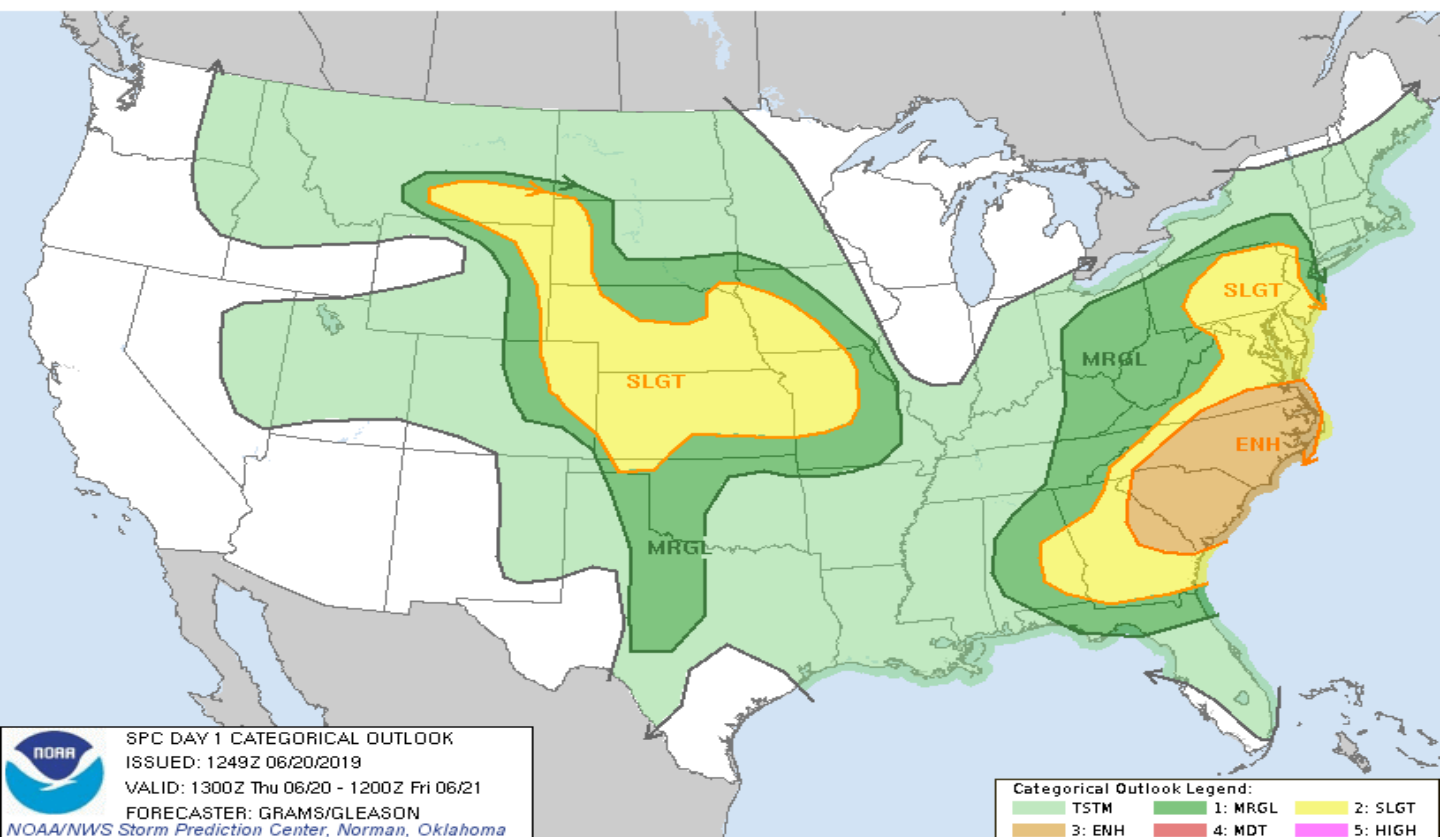

Severe Threat Increased for Later Today and This Evening

Overview: A cold front will move across the area late tonight. Instability, wind shear as well as timing of the day will be favorable for severe weather across our area. The Storm Prediction Center now has all of the area in an Enhanced Risk.

Impacts: The highest threat is severe wind gusts in excess of 60 MPH with some severe hail possible.

Timing/Confidence: Confidence is high that a broken line of thunderstorms will develop to our west later this afternoon and become better organized and stronger as it moves to the coast through the evening hours. The activity should move into our western counties around 5 PM and race quickly to the coast near 9 PM.



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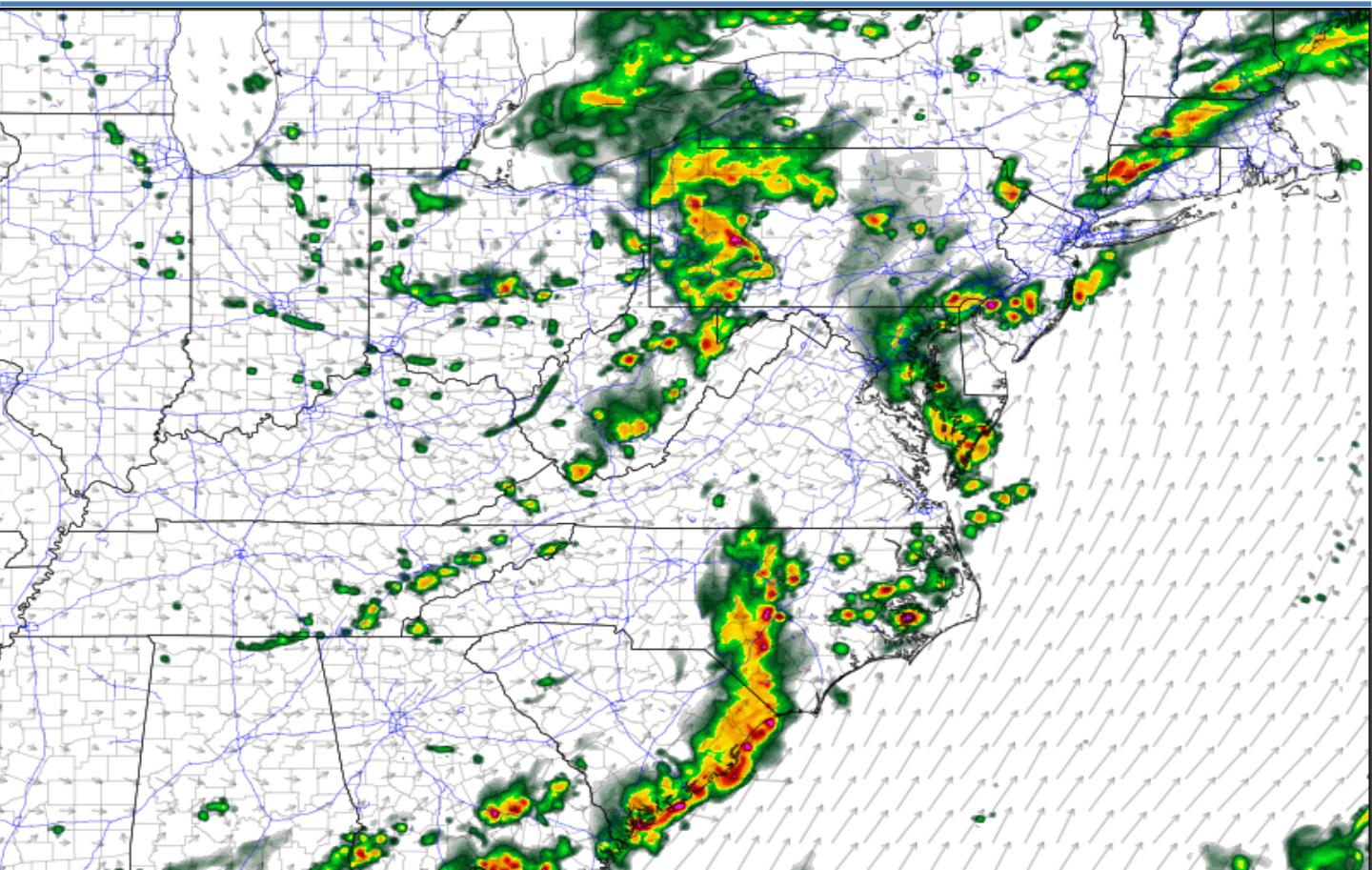


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Severe Threat Increased for Later Thursday
