Outlook Period: **Early next week**
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Possible Tropical Development Early Next Week off of the Southeast Coast

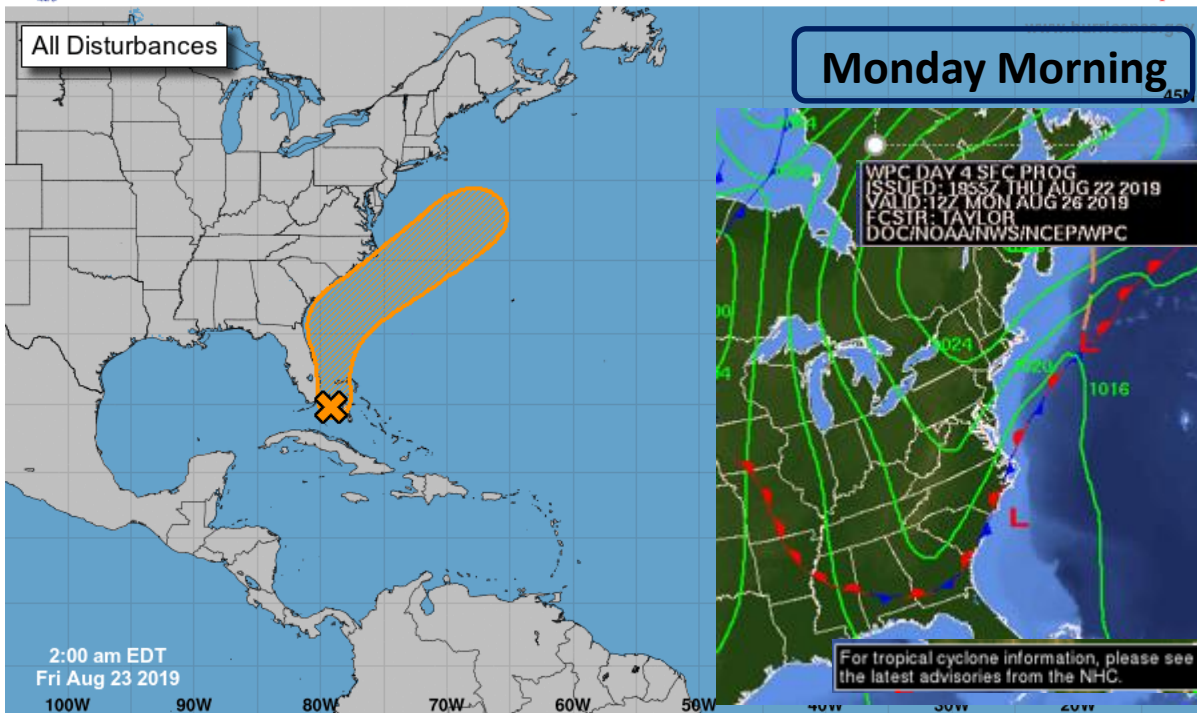
Overview: A broad area of low pressure has formed in the central Bahamas. This system may become a tropical depression over the weekend or early next week according to the National Hurricane Center and is currently forecast to move offshore of the Southeast coast. The National Hurricane Center has the formation chance through 5 days as 60 percent.

Impacts: Too early to tell with much uncertainty in terms of development and track of this low. As it looks now, main impacts would be for marine community and possibly higher surf and stronger rip currents at the local beaches.

Timing/Confidence: Current model projections have its closest passage near 150 miles east to southeast of the tip of Cape Fear Sun night through Monday, but much uncertainty exists.
