Highlights

- Crisp Fall weather today through the weekend for most of the area with some of the coldest temperatures of the season.
- As low pressure develops along lingering front well off the coast of Cape Fear, some low clouds and slight chance of a sprinkle will be possible closer to the coast through Saturday morning.
- Reinforcing shot of cold and dry air will come late Saturday through Sunday with brisk northerly winds.
- Patchy frost will be possible in wind sheltered spots, mainly west of I-95 early Sunday morning.
- The coldest temperatures of the season will come Sunday night with some spots down within a few degrees of freezing well inland.
- For marine interests, Small Craft Advisory conditions will end today, but may come back briefly with cold surge early Sunday.









Coastal Locations vs. Inland Locations





Minimum Temperature




