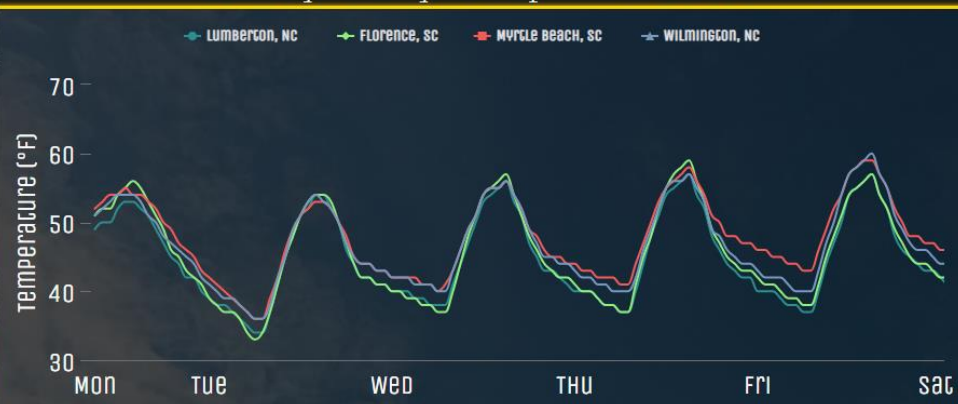
Outlook Period: December 2-6, 2019

Overview: High pressure will bring dry weather to the area for much of the week. A low chance of showers is introduced on Friday as low pressure develops just offshore. Gusty W/NW winds today will diminish through Tuesday. Temperatures will be slightly below normal through Tuesday, and then be very close to normal mid to late in the week.

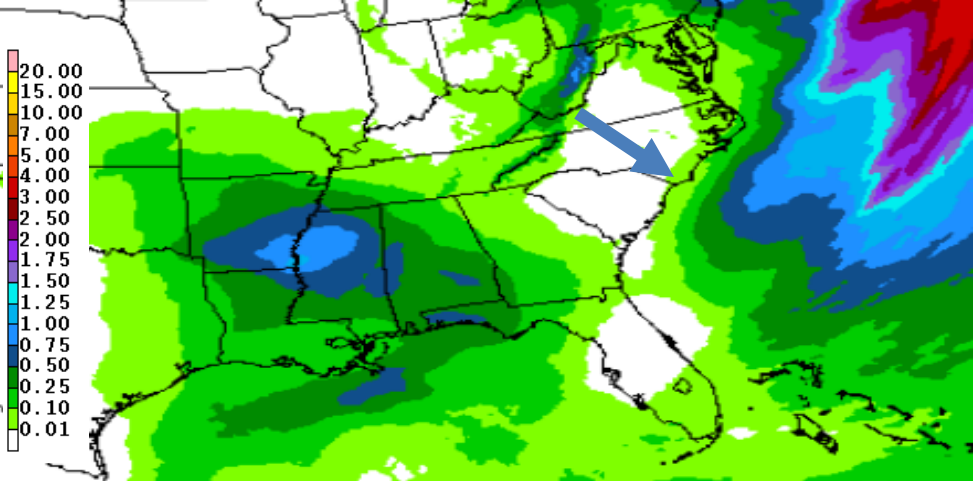
Impacts: Wind chills will be in the upper 20s to low 30s across the area late tonight and into Tuesday morning. Morning wind chills will gradually warm through the middle and second part of the week. Meanwhile, a Gale Warning is in effect until early Tuesday morning. Marine conditions will generally improve through midweek.
