Resolution to Adopt the FY 17-18 Budget Ordinance for the Fiscal Year Beginning July 1, 2017

WHEREAS, The budget preparation process began in January with budget instructions being sent to Department Heads, Outside Agencies and Fire Departments; and

WHEREAS, A proposed budget was submitted to the BOCC on May 1, 2017. Budget work sessions were held on April 25, May 8, and May 11 and the required public hearing was held on May 15; and

WHEREAS, The proposed budget ordinance provides for a FY 17-18 property tax rate based on \$6,878,490,142; and

WHEREAS, The proposed budget ordinance provides for a FY 17-18 property tax rate of \$.685 per \$100 valuation of property listed as of January 1, 2017; and

WHEREAS, The FY 17/18 Budget includes a 1.5% Cost of Living Adjustment (COLA) as well as 100% of recent Salary Study conducted by the Cape Fear Council of Governments which will both be instituted July 2017; and

WHEREAS, The Pender County Board of County Commissioners continues to strive toward success with its four core strategic priorities: A High Performing Organization; A Sustainable and Vibrant Economy; Excellence in Education; and a Diverse County with an Exceptional Quality of Life.

NOW, THEREFORE IT BE RESOLVED by the Pender County Board of Commissioners that the FY 17-18 Budget Ordinance is hereby approved (as presented or as amended at the meeting) and is attached as part of this resolution.

Section 20. The Budget Officer is hereby authorized to transfer appropriations as contained herein under the following conditions:

- a. He may transfer amounts between line item expenditures within a department without limitation and without a report being required.
- b. He may transfer amounts up to \$10,000 between departments, including contingency appropriations, within the same fund. They must make an official report on such transfers at the next regular meeting of the Board of Commissioners.
- He may not transfer any amounts between funds, except as approved by the Board of Commissioners in the Budget Ordinance as amended.

Section 21. Effective July 1, 2017, the following are in effect in expenditure control:

- Purchase orders are required for any purchases over \$500.
- b. Formal approval from the Board is required for all "non-routine" expenditures exceeding \$15,000. Routine expenditures include utilities, legally required advertising, postage, fuel, and water or sewer purchase contracts.
- c. Emergency approval of purchase orders exceeding \$15,000 may be conveyed by the County Manager in consultation with the Chair of the Board of County Commissioners and subsequent notification of the Board.

Section 22. The Finance Director is authorized to transfer amounts up to \$7,500.00 between line item expenditures within a department without limitation, without Budget Officer approval and without a report being required. These changes should not result in increases in recurring obligations such as salaries.

Section 23. Operating funds encumbered on the financial records as of June 30, 2017, are hereby reappropriated to this budget.

Section 24. County department requests for new position/reclassifications and wages in the General Fund this year totaled \$1,088,947.79 with \$607,347.81 being recommended. Twelve new positions are recommended. An Assistant County Manager in the Manager's office due to the current workload of administrative duties, a part-time Housing Specialist in the Housing department due to a need to provide sufficient coverage to ensure certifications are completed timely and accurately, a Senior Accountant in the Finance department to handle existing workload and to perform additional review and analytical review, a Purchasing Agent in the Finance department to perform centralized purchasing functions, a Deputy Register of Deeds II due to a departmental workload that has increased over previous years, a Floodplain Administrator in the Planning Department due to the continued growth of the County and the need to balance the development pressures with natural hazard protection, a Permit Technician in the Planning department due to an estimated population increase of 27% between 2016 and 2029, a parttime Office Assistant IV in the Parks & Recreation (Planning) department to perform office duties so the Range Safety Officers can focus on range operations, a CSI Detective in the Sheriff's office due to an increase of evidence that has to be gathered and stored, a Meter Reader and a Water and Sewer Maintenance Technician I within the Utilities department due to the addition of 1,200 new water customers in the Central Pender and Moore's Creek Water Distribution System which will be funded with Enterprise funds, and a Transfer Station Scalehouse Operator in the Utilities department due to an increasing population and the additional need for solid waste disposal services.

A reclassification of the Administrative Assistant II to Administrative Assistant II/Deputy Clerk in the Planning department is being recommended to assist the Clerk in times of absence which will not present any additional cost, a reclassification of the IM Supervisor II in the HHS/Social Services department to IM Supervisor II - Lead to provide backup when the Program Manager is away which will be funded at 50% by Medicaid reimbursement, a reclassification of Deputy Register of Deeds II to Assistant Register of Deeds II due to the need for a qualified employee to oversee the County's vital records for safekeeping and accountability, an increase in the Range Safety Officers hourly pay is being recommended in the Parks & Recreation (Planning) department to compensate for the necessary expertise in firearms and firearm safety, an increase/job title change for the Office Assistant III to Office Assistant III - Tourism for the additional expertise and knowledge that is required of the position, an increase/job title change/new position creation from Project Manager to Assistant Public Utilities Director in the Utilities department due to the responsibilities and requirements that have doubled over prior years, an increase/job title change/new position creation from Chemist to Senior Environmental Chemist-Surface due to the addition of the new Pender Commerce Wastewater Treatment Plant and an additional lab to operate, an increase for the Administrative Officer I in the Health department due to assuming many new duties of the position, an increase for the Animal Shelter Manager in the Health department due to the transformation of the Animal Shelter program, a reclassification, which will be 100% funded by Medicaid and fees, of the Dental Assistant to Dental Hygienist II in the Health department due to the actual functions performed in this capacity, an increase/title change, which will be fully funded by Medicaid and fees of the Dental Hygienist II to Dental Hygienist II - Supervisor due to the supervision of the department, an increase/title change which will be fully state and federally funded, of the WIC Director to Nutrition & WIC Director II in the

Health department due to the management of 2.5 additional staff and increased caseload, an increase/title change, which will be fully funded by Medicaid and fees of the Public Health Nurse III to Public Health Nurse III, Coordinator, Community Care of Children in the Health department due to the added responsibility of the Pender County Child Fatality Prevention team, a reclassification, which will be fully state and federally funded of the Processing Assistant IV to Processing Assistant V in the Health department due to assuming additional duties within the position. A new position classification is being requested for the Public Buildings department; Public Buildings Director, which will not cost any additional funds as the position will be re-organized within the department.

An increase in the retainer for the County Attorney, which is a contracted position, is being requested at a cost of \$6,000.00 and was recommended by Chris May, Executive Director of the Cape Fear Council of Governments. This increase takes the Regional Average Starting Salary (RASS) into consideration and compares the average starting salaries to surrounding benchmarks. Salary increases for the Cooperative Extension are being recommended at 2% pending approval from NC State per the Memorandum of Understanding, and a 4-H Program Assistant is being recommended for \$5,000 which is 100% funding of the position by Pender County.

A salary study was conducted by the Cape Fear Council of Governments (COG). Using the Regional Average Starting Salary (RASS), minimums and maximums were set and a pay scale was established with steps and grades. Each classification was adjusted up to the minimum starting salary. Then each employee in that class was adjusted up to the next closest step on that pay scale, thus establishing a practical and usable compensation strategy that will keep the county competitive. The study provides a base resulting from the fair placement of employees into an ordered grade and step pay scale. This study and a 1.5% COLA are being recommended for an effective date of July 3, 2017, which will be paid on July 20, 2017. If implemented in July 2017, the result would be a total of \$968,037.75.

The North Carolina Department of State Treasurer Retirement Systems Division has notified the county that employer contribution rates have increased from 7.25% to 7.56% for general employees and from 8.00% to 8.25% for Law Enforcement in FY 17/18.

Section 25. The State Health Plan Board of Trustees has approved some benefit changes effective January 1, 2018. The Freezing of family health care premiums is an effort to improve the affordability of Plan benefits for families. They have also approved the elimination of the Consumer-Directed Health Plan (CDHP 85/15) in an effort to reduce complexity and provide long-term financial stability. This plan is known as the "richest" and, as such, presents a significant liability to the State. Other changes include reducing the wellness premium credit activities from three to one, and only keeping the tobacco attestation activity and setting employee-only base premiums for the Traditional 70/30 Plan at \$25 per month, and for the Enhanced 80/20 Plan at \$50 per month. This will help to create a balanced approach for spreading cost increases across the population. No information has yet been forwarded regarding any increases in the employer premium cost, which is currently \$479.48 per employee per month. Employees pay for dental, vision and the cost of family/dependent care

Section 26. Copies of this Budget Ordinance shall be furnished to the Clerk to the Board of Commissioners and to the Budget Officer and Finance Director to be kept on file by them for their direction in the disbursement of funds.

Section 27. There is hereby established, for the Fiscal Year 2017-2018, various fees and charges, as set forth in Attachment "A" (Pender County Fee Schedule-FY 2017-2018, Effective July, 1 2017).
