Administration

- · Conducted and reviewed 16 applicants, followed by the background and reference checks on candidate to hire full time 4-H Youth Development Agent to replace Liz Hamm, who resigned effective April 6.
- · Began the process of replacing the part time 4-H program assistant and the part time Expanded Youth and Families (EYFP) Program Assistant.
- · Pender County Extension received funding from NCSU to purchase a commercial drone for research, education and demonstration purposes. Per FAA and NCSU regulations the County Extension Director will be taking the drone pilot license exam before utilizing this resource.
- · Helped the Topsail HS Agriculture teachers conduct interviews for the schools' seven Future Farmers of America (FFA) officer positions for the 2021-2022 school year. Topsail High School has the largest FFA chapters in Pender County. In addition to learning about livestock and food production, FFA members learn about the importance of agriculture in Pender County, NC and the USA, as well as leadership, commitment, honesty and integrity.
- · Assisted Wilmington Area YMCA staff in connecting with Pender County community leaders to recruit individuals and companies to participate in health and wellness classes. YMCA has grant funding to conduct these classes at no cost to area residents.
- · Spearheaded the Pender County Farm Worker Health Task Force to help local farm workers get Covid-19 vaccinations. A mobile vaccination clinic is scheduled at the Cape Fear Middle/Elementary school parking lot on May 8, 15 and 23 to help get these people their vaccines.

Agriculture - Mark Seitz

- · Two freeze events in April slowed down and or damaged some strawberry and blueberry fields. No significant crop loss.
- · No significant crop loss occurred in wheat across the county.
- · Field corn planting is nearly complete as dry conditions throughout April allowed farmers to plant without interruption. However, almost no rain fell in the month of April and hot, sunny, windy conditions in late April, with no rain in the forecast, is going to put this corn crop at risk of suffering from significant drought stress.
- · With assistance from Han-dy-Land Farms in Maple Hill, a 16-variety field corn demonstration plot was planted on April 26. The site is on Hwy 53 about 1 mile south of the Hwy 50/53 intersection right along the highway. NC Cooperative Extension signs identifying the individual varieties verysoon.
- · Another test will be planted in this area to look at the effectiveness of having soybean seed treated with a fungicide/insecticide versus not being treated to control seedling diseases.
- \cdot The Vacation Supported Agriculture (VSA) program led by NCSU is helping area farmers connect with people who rent homes, or condominiums in Surf City, receive a basket of fresh, local produce. The VSA program is open to any produce farmer in Pender, New Hanover or Brunswick County who wants to sell produce to visitors here at the coast.

4-H Youth Development – the 4-H Youth Development Agent resigned April 6. The position is expected to be filled in early May.

4-H Program Activities - Traci Spencer, 4-H Program Assistant

- · 4-H Coastal Plains Chicken Show Alex Grover from Pender County finished 4th in the district. This program helps youth learn about raising and caring for livestock.
- · Embryology Surf City and Rocky Point Elementary received eggs to incubate in their 3rd grade classrooms.
- · 4-H Teen Retreat was held April 20 via Zoom. Lillie Hansen was elected as the Southeast Extension District Teen Vice President.
- · Zane Anderson, 4-H club member with the High Fliers 4-H Club in Hampstead, applied for the state level vice president position of 4-H Teen Council.
- · Finalizing plans for 4-H Summer Day Camp programs at the Pender County Extension office. Call Traci Spencer, 4-H Program Assistant at 910-259-1393 for more information.

Empowering Youth and Families Program (EYFP) - Traci Spencer, EYFP Program Assistant

- · Sessions A, B, C and D of the spring 2021 cohort for Pender County families involved in the EYFP program were held in conjunction Lee County families on a virtual basis.
- · EYFP Assistant attended the Watauga Compassionate Community Initiative Conference via Zoom.
- · Program Assistant attended the Pender County resiliency task force meeting. Working on plans for community outreach. Met with the Community in Schools representatives to coordinate efforts.

Area Natural Resources - Amy Mead

- Agent attended a 3-day Association of Natural Resources Extension Professionals Climate Professional Improvement Conference. Focused on climate related programming within Extension and Federal level priorities and programs.
- Concluded the 8-week Backyard Sustainability Class series this week. This was a big success and I will hold this series again next spring
- I participated in Pollinator Palooza, an online web event highlighting pollinators and native plant habitat. This was
 hosted by the NC Coastal Landtrust and was a collaboration with NC Cooperative Extension, the City of Wilmington,
 and Airlie Gardens.
- Planning a Pender County Rain Garden/Stormwater workshop for early summer with the Pender County Consumer Horticulture Agent.

Consumer Horticulture - Tiffanee Boone

- \cdot The Horticulture Agent conducted home visits and answered gardening and pest questions by phone, text, email and Facebook.
- · Participating in professional development sessions: NC State University Plants, Pests, and Pathogens webinars and NC Forestry Council webinars.
- · Cut down several cat briars and volunteer oak trees in shrubs of the Burgaw Extension garden.
- · Pender County Extension Master Gardeners volunteers have been weeding, mulching, and flame torching the teaching gardens around the Extension office, Burgaw library, Hampstead library, and Poplar Grove. Other maintenance work included: water sealing the stairs, picnic table, planting table, and storage shed ramp at the Burgaw Extension

garden. They dug up and framed the walkway in front of their shed in preparation for a concrete pour by Pender County Fleet and Facilities staff. It has been a great partnership!

- · The next Pender County Extension Master Gardeners Speakers Bureau event will be conducted by webinar. They have a schedule of different gardening topics to do by webinar. They are partnering with the library system to bring these presentations to more people. The last one was about general gardening. They will meet in May to plan next year's Speaker's Bureau topics and dates that will go back to being in person.
- · Pender County Extension Master Gardeners: have an "Ask a Master Gardener" booth at the Poplar Grove Farmer's Market to answer gardening and lawn questions; they have been meeting through zoom and will start in person meetings in May; have been working to update our Pender Extension Master Gardeners webpage; and they made 30 new calendars which serves as their fund-raising project.
- · Due to Covid-19 restrictions Horticulture in the Classroom YouTube videos are being created for use by Pender County Elementary School teachers to use to continue the Horticulture in the Classroom Program that has been going on for many years in Pender County Schools. Recent topics for first grade students are: pollinators, butterflies, and insects.



The Tourism Staff prepared giveaway bags for the I-95 NC Welcome Center for the **National Tourism Week.**

We continue to monitor travel sentiment by virtually attending Destination Analysis Webinars.

Stephanie met virtually with **NC Arts Council Staff** to research potential grant opportunities for various projects.

Stephanie is working with our historical entities and the **NC Folklife Institute** on several grant nominations for the first round of applicants in the **NC Legends and Lore Marker program**.

Pender County Tourism's **African American Heritage Trail** committee is growing, due to overwhelming interest. We met on April 30 virtually.

We attended the North Carolina Beach Inlet and Waterway Association spring conference, virtually.

Olivia attended the **monthly tourism meeting** with Surf City.

We continue to update our **social media platforms** – tourism has six pages.

Sharks Night is confirmed for Sunday, June 6. We look forward to hosting that evening with Parks & Recreation. We will begin promoting that event.

The **2021 Nature Photography** has already received many entries. The contest accepts entries through May 3.

Beach Week continues to be well received as visitors are increasing as the season begins.

Pender County attractions are opening after COVID closures and upcoming events are being scheduled which increases our visitors to the area, so we are working to make sure we have that **up-to-date information available**.

We continue to share pertinent information for business loans, restaurant restoration loans, from the

state and federal government to our tourism-related businesses.

We continue to participate in various **sub-committees** for county employees.

We attended our **tourism budget meeting** with the commissioners.

We submitted a **press release** for the library, parks and recreation, and the health department.

UTILITY OPERATIONS

PENDER COUNTY UTILITIES (PCU) & WATER DISTRICTS:

The Annex & Kiwanis Park well facilities are operational, although a few punch list items are still being completed at Kiwanis. Also, the new driveway at the Kiwanis Park well site is still under construction.

The Maple Hill water system interconnections with ONWASA began operational testing this week. There are some operational issues we are working on that may require a change order to allow automatic operation of the connection. Full switch-over from Chinquapin to ONWASA water for the Maple Hill water district is still expected be accomplished no later than June.

Field staff work and status updates since last report:

- · Automatic flush valve on daily flush on Riverland Drive and Old Landing Road
- · 5 water taps by staff and two service repairs
- 7 water taps by Utilitech (contractor)
- 349 locates in the last two weeks. Several located for gas company totaling over five miles. The amount of locates limits the staff's ability to complete other tasks, especially with us still being one technician short (new technician to start May 17th).
- Coordinated ONWASA trial at both inter-connections in Maple Hill.
- · One meter reader out until mid-June.
- Met and discussed spray irrigation crop management with provider.

WATER TREATMENT PLANT

We've had 3 tours of the Water Plant over the past 2 weeks. These groups of students were from the Cape Fear Community College Marine Tech program.

Hach was on-site for the plant's quarterly turbidimeter calibrations.

Backwashed GAC #3 (see attached photos). With the new protocols in place for GAC backwashing we are seeing more efficiency and longer run times.

We are starting to see an uptick in water usage and we are gearing up for the usual high demand increase around Memorial Day Weekend.

Production numbers through April 28th: 39.9 million gallons for an average of 1.43 MGD.

PCP WASTEWATER TREATMENT PLANT - MKKAES (Melinda K. Knoezer Adaptive Ecosystem)

Discharge numbers continue to be great. We have conducted three more plant tours with CFCC. Site mowing has commenced. Monthly report has been completed. Staff is working on quotes for upcoming projects.

SOLID WASTE

The Transfer Station scale house staff is creating about 115 tickets daily for disposal records. Waiting time at scales is about 10 minutes IN and 10 minutes OUT.

ITS is installing new computer with updates. We are handwriting all disposal tickets until we will be

able to put information in computer application.
