Pender County Utilities (PCU) News 11/11/2022

PENDER COUNTY UTILITIES (PCU) & WATER DISTRICTS:

PCU has implemented a call and text notification system for delinquent water accounts. Prior to this system, we had to cut off over 200 customers. For the month of October, we only had to cut off 91 water accounts for non-payment.

Water meters are in short supply due to supply chain issues. PCU is temporarily unable to issue irrigation meters, as we need to prioritize our supply to customers that need water for their homes and businesses. It is possible that even those meters may become limited in the near future. We have active orders for more meters but have been given delivery dates of January 2023 or later.

Field staff work and status updates since last report:

- Extensive water line flushing in the Hampstead area
- 4 new water taps completed by staff
- 11 new water taps completed by contractor
- Staff repaired twelve-inch water main break at intersection of Bell Williams and Hwy 210
- Staff repaired four-inch force main leak at Regional lift station
- Staff replaced faulty pump and motor at 210 booster station
- Staff repaired two damaged water services
- · Completed interviews for Utility Locator position
- Meter reading county wide

- Working on a comprehensive list of fire hydrants to be repaired or replaced
- Check all sewer lift stations for proper function
- Test all high-level floats at sewer lift stations
- 2 after-hours emergency calls staff responded too
- 17 Water meter inspections completed
- Numerous water meter sets completed
- 100 plus work orders completed

• Automatic flush valves on Riverland Dr, Michigan Ave, Old Landing Rd, Royal Tern Dr, Bahama Dr, Deer Run, Racoon Rd, and Manhollow Church Rd

- · 437 plus locates in last two weeks
- The amount of locates is extremely limiting to staff to complete other tasks

### MAPLE HILL WATER SYSTEM & WASTEWATER TREATMENT PLANT

- · Wastewater samples collected today for the wastewater plant
- The lagoon is looking good
- Odor problems have died down now I need to work on the green algae in the lagoon
- Groundwater wells were sampled on Monday, November 6

• Flushing some of the dead ends but I still need 2 to 3 hydrants fixed and some blow-off put in the system.

• At the transfer station, the yard hydrant is going to have to be replaced. There's a hole in the bottom of the pipe. A temporary fix has been applied.

### WATER TREATMENT PLANT

- All water and wastewater licenses for the plant's staff have been renewed for 2023.
- BFPE was on-site to perform fire extinguisher testing.

• Hach was on-site to complete quarterly calibration and verification of turbidimeters and chlorine analyzers.

• Staff from both plants assisted in repairs to the air compressor.

• The GAC exchange that was originally scheduled for Nov. 7th was pushed back to Nov. 29th due to carbon availability.

• Overall, the plant is running well with no issues.

• Total water production numbers for October: 49.22 million gallons for an average of 1.59 MGD. This was slightly over our projected usage of 48.90 million gallons.

• Production numbers for November through the 9th: 13.40 million gallons for an average of 1.49 MGD.

PCP WASTEWATER TREATMENT PLANT - MKKAES (Melinda K. Knoezer Adaptive Ecosystem)

The wastewater plant is running well. We are gearing up for winter and the storms that come with it.

• We welcome the new help (Dustin) Maintenance Tech. He has jumped right in and is proving to be a big help.

• We'd like to take a moment to thank our veterans including the ones we have on staff shout out to Brian.
